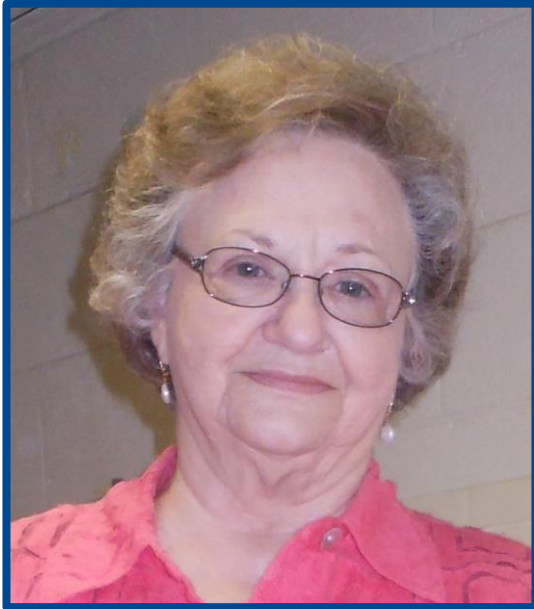


# Your Chapter Achievement Awards Committee Chair

# Chapter Achievement Awards History

- The Honor Roll Committee was authorized in April 1953. The CAA was established in June 1955. Name change from “Honor Roll Committee” to “Chapter Achievement Awards Committee” was authorized in 1996.
- In December 2011, the CAA form became available electronically (eCAA) and paper forms were no longer accepted. In 2014, the CAA was incorporated into the CMR and chapters were required to complete the form through e-Membership.
- The CAA form is based on a point counting method. Points earned by chapter result in attaining a Level One, Level Two, or Level Three award.
- The CAA programs and activities reflect the National Society’s mission objectives – historical preservation, patriotism and education. CAA provides a “snapshot” of chapter’s overall performance.

# Chapter Achievement Awards

## Purpose

- The purpose of the CAA Committee is to report chapter accomplishments over the past calendar year and plan for future accomplishments. The CAA report is a measuring tool for gauging health of a chapter and is a reflection on its achievements during the year.
- Chapters should set obtainable goals in support of National Society's three-fold mission: historical preservation, patriotism, and education.
- CAA form reflects chapter financial contributions, chapter/member participation in Service and Genealogy Committees, and Member Training Courses.

# Chapter Achievement Award 2020 Updates

- Paper forms will not be included in the NIP.  
Use the CAA Committee Webpage on the Members' Website to plan your chapter's yearly goals.
- CAA Levels are as follows: Level 1 = 400 points +, Level 2 = 300 points +, Level 3 = 200 points +
- Section 1B: National Dues: Chapter Direct Payment points have been added
- Section 4: Registrar Training Course has been added.
- Section 8: All minimum monetary chapter contributions must be sent through the State Treasurer to the Treasurer General for CAA credit. If minimum contributions to combined funds total \$100 or more, score 175 points, otherwise score 0 points.
- "Save CAA and Display Totals" will save the info and total the points earned.
- Once the form is saved, chapter leaders may access the report as often as necessary BEFORE February 1, 2021 and edit the responses as needed by clicking on "Edit CAA."

# Chapter Achievement Awards 20/21 Planning Guide

- Use the 2020 CAA Planning Guide to plan activities and contributions throughout the year. Lead chapter to attain highest possible achievement in service to DAR by leading chapter in increasing Membership and Contributions, encouraging participation in Service Committees, Genealogy Committees, and in member Training.
- **CAA report covers period January 1 to December 31.**  
**National deadline for CMR which contains the CAA form is February 1, 2021.**
- Remember, when planning chapter programs, lead the chapter in the DAR mission areas of historic preservation, education and patriotism; supporting the National Society; and welcoming new members to DAR.

# Chapter Achievement Awards

## Achievements and Goals

- In 2019, four Alabama chapters attained points totaling 1,000 and above.  
The points were primarily the result of increases in the chapter's membership.
- The goal of chapters should be to attain the highest possible point count.  
The goal of the CAA Committee is for the maximum number of chapters to achieve over 1,000 points.
- Recognize chapters and their regents with the highest point count (1,000 or above) at next State Conference.
